## Compliance Status

**Partially compliant** in accordance with the UNI CEI EN 301549:2022 standard

This website is partially compliant with the requirements set out in Annex A of the UNI CEI EN 301549:2022 standard, due to the cases of non-compliance listed below and described in more detail in the relevant assessment report held by the service provider.

## Non-accessible content

Some content is not accessible due to partial or incomplete compliance with the provisions set out in Annex A of the UNI CEI EN 301549:2022 standard.

In some cases, labels or instructions are not provided when content requires user input actions;

In some cases, when an input error is detected and suggestions are known, the item in error is not identified and/or the error is not communicated to the user;

In some cases, the name or role of components cannot be programmatically determined; user-settable states, properties, and values are not programmatically determinable, or notifications of state changes are not available;

The information contained in this accessibility statement was obtained from an assessment [carried out by third parties](#) holding [UNI 11621-3](#) qualifications, with [ECFPROFESSIONAL2025-000080](#) as the registration number, through objective and subjective analyses (see Article 3(1) of Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2018/1523).

## Techniques used to verify the criteria

A mix of automatic and semi-automatic validators promoted by the W3C, listed in the W3C Evaluation Tools List, was used. Assistive technologies were also used, such as screen readers, voice access, keyboard navigation, and TalkBack, including NVDA, JAWS, ChromeVox, Magnifier, Gboard, Voice Access, TalkBack, Accessibility Scanner, Switch Access, VoiceOver, and Spoken Content.

A manual inspection was carried out by manipulating the “DOM” (Document Object Model) source code using DevTools, Web Developer Toolbar, Lighthouse, PageSpeed, WebIAM, Siteimprove, A11y, AxeCore, Silktide Inspector, AccessiWeb Scanner, AccessiWeb API with AgilityPack, AccessiWeb Webserver, zoom, high contrast, rendering with “Emulate vision deficiencies”, verification of ARIA roles and attributes, markup semantics, and parsing. Tests were performed across different combinations of browsers, devices, resolutions, orientations, and user agents, for a total of 117 checking techniques, described in more detail in the relevant assessment report held by the service provider.
